

## Some of the new courses in Semester One 2022 will include -

### Let's Talk

**Wednesday 9.30 - 12.30 pm**

This program provides a platform for students to actively engage in relevant and essential English language communication. With a focus on verbal communication, this program explores the way we use and speak Australian English.

### Starting Out With Computers

**Monday 9.30 - 12.30 pm**

This course is an introduction to digital skills for entry level learners who have not used computers/devices or lack basic skills and confidence with technology and/or the online environment.

### Attaining Literacy

**Monday 9.30 - 12.30 pm**

This program is designed to support community members in reaching their basic social learning goals. The class is intended to assist particularly vulnerable learners in improving their basic language and literacy skills.

### Digital Sessions

**Thursdays 9.30 - 12.30 pm**

This class allows learners to delve into more specific elements of the digital world, by teaching practical skills conducive to modern life. It includes 'Moving Online' where students learn about creating secure passwords and accounts, paperless bills, online banking and 'Staying Safe Online' where students learn to identify scams and unsafe sites.

**Angliss Neighbourhood House** courses are for people who are keen to improve their reading, writing, listening and speaking skills. We offer people the chance to learn and practice their English skills in a comfortable, informal and relaxed atmosphere, at a low cost. Students will have the opportunity to improve their reading and writing skills for day to day life, for employment or for further study.

As a small, friendly and accessible neighbourhood house we are well placed to support student's individual learning needs and to assist them in achieving the best possible learning outcomes. All our staff make every effort to provide relevant information about course selection, pathways and ongoing training options.

The house provides support, skill development and social activities. We deliver quality adult education programs that reflect the interests and needs of all sectors of our community.

Classes run all year round on a school term basis. If you would like to enrol a potential student in an **accredited class** you will need to make an appointment for an interview to ensure learners are placed in the class most appropriate to their needs. The interview will determine eligibility and enrolment at their certificate level. \*In 2022 modules from the 22485VIC Certificate II in EAL Frameworks (Access) is being offered.

If eligible, tuition is \$30 per term concession and fee exemption is available for students facing financial hardship. Concession prices only apply to self-funded individuals. Organisations providing funding (even indirectly) are not eligible for concession rates.
