Staff will make every effort to provide you with relevant information about course selection and ongoing training options. The houses provides support, skill development and social activities. Classes run all year round on a school term basis and. If you are eligible, tuition is \$25 per term concession and fee exemption is available for students facing financial hardship.



Concession prices only apply to self-funded individuals. A statement of fees is available on our website.

The Angliss Neighbourhood House classes that are being delivered in 2023 are pre-accredited Learn Local courses that aim to provide opportunities for people to participate in learning for a range of purposes including work, education, volunteering and community engagement. Courses are subsidised through the State Government Adult Community and Further Education Board, provided individuals meet the Victorian Eligibility requirements.

The House offers a wide range of pre-accredited reading, writing, language and computer classes.
